Trustee

Move Momentum is a local charity based in Winchester, Hampshire that aims to make dance accessible to everyone. We provide inclusive and affordable dance classes for people who otherwise might not have the opportunity to enjoy the benefits of dance. We offer weekly dance classes for young people aged 11-16, over 65s and wheelchair users.

Title	Trustee
Objectives	Trustees have overall control of a charity and are responsible for making sure it's doing what it was set up to do. Trustees are the people who lead the charity and decide how it is run. Being a trustee means making decisions that will impact people's lives. As a trustee for Move Momentum, you will be making a difference in our local community. In addition to the above statutory duties, each trustee should use any specific skills, knowledge or experience they have, to help the board of trustees reach sound decisions. Trustees should use their skills and experience to support Move Momentum, helping them achieve their aims. Trustees also
	often learn new skills during their time on the board.
Hours expected	Quarterly annual meetings. We will also send emails with charity updates and sometimes request trustee decisions or request documents to be reviewed. We may also ask for help on specific charity events or tasks but this will be at the trustee's discretion
Tasks	 Attend quarterly board meetings To ensure that the organisation complies with its governing document, charity law, company law and any other relevant legislation or regulations. To ensure that the organisation pursues its objects as defined in its governing document.

	 To ensure the organisation applies its resources exclusively in pursuance of its objects (the charity must not spend money on activities that are not included in its own objects, no matter how worthwhile or charitable those activities are). To contribute actively to the board of trustees' role in giving firm strategic direction to the organisation, setting overall policy, defining goals and setting targets and evaluating performance against agreed targets. To safeguard the good name and values of the organisation. To ensure the effective and efficient administration of the organisation. To ensure the financial stability of the organisation. To protect and manage the property of the charity and to ensure the proper investment of the charity's funds. If the charity employs staff: to appoint the chief executive officer and monitor his/her performance.
