

Winchester based dance charity Move Momentum awarded up to £10,000 and place on learning programme to improve local community

28th July 2020 - Local Winchester dance charity <u>Move Momentum</u> is one of 71 organisations across England selected for a competitive learning programme and grant of up to £10,000.

The Community Business Trade Up Programme is run by the School for Social Entrepreneurs, in partnership with Power to Change. The programme supports people improving their local communities through trade.

The programme will help to grow Move Momentum which aims to make dance accessible to all – offering classes targeted at young people, over 65s and people with physical disabilities.

Amanda Watkinson, Project Manager at Move Momentum will soon begin a nine-month learning programme at the School for Social Entrepreneurs (SSE). SSE helps people develop the skills, strengths and networks they need to tackle society's biggest problems.

About Momentum

Momentum is a local dance charity based in Winchester, founded in 2016 by Louise Todino and started with their Academies. In 2018, Amanda Watkinson took on the role of Project Manager for Momentum, overseeing all the projects and developing the charity. Since then the charity has expanded to deliver classes for over 65's as part of their GEMS project and then most recently developed Liberate Dance, an exclusively wheelchair-based dance company, alongside Vickie Simmonds, a GB Para Hockey player.

Momentum provides dance classes that are accessible, inclusive and affordable for everyone. We support individuals' mental and physical well-being and focus on enriching their quality of life by creating accessible opportunities, encouraging self-expression and supporting individuality.

About the Community Business Trade Up Programme

The Community Business Trade Up Programme is run by School for Social Entrepreneurs (SSE), in partnership with Power to Change. The programme includes 12 learning days, spread over nine months. It includes a Match Trading grant of up to £10,000 for early-stage community businesses that are planning to grow. It supports community business leaders to increase their income and build stronger organisations, so they can create more benefit to their local areas. The programme has supported over 200 community businesses so far, and will support another 71 in this phase at seven SSE locations across England. This phase runs from April 2020 to December 2020.

About the School for Social Entrepreneurs

SSE helps 1,000 people a year develop the skills, strengths and networks they need to tackle society's biggest problems.
